


Each time you shop and scan your phone, a portion of your shop is automatically attributed to the School without the need to scan an additional key tag. Please follow the step by step guide attached.

A RRHAN-EC (Responding to Harm, Abuse and Neglect in Education and Care) training certificate with new expiry date of Decmber 2027

Work Health and Safety on-line induction for Volunteers Certificate

Work Health Safety signed form

Please note: That all these processes are mandatory and must be completed in order to volunteer/continue to volunteer. This requirement is designed to ensure our children are protected and safe at school.
