From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers.

This week we celebrated the feast day of Mary of the Cross Mackillop with a special prayer service and some fun activities for the students, including a special BBQ lunch. We were able to reflect on her wonderful achievements in establishing the Sisters of St Joseph's and gain an understanding of the incredible person she was, especially her love for educating children and her love for God. Thank you to all our volunteers who assisted us on the day. It was lovely to have the use of our community kitchen and see how easy it is to use, especially for community events. I would like to remind our families that you are welcome to attend our Monday morning prayer each week in the Parish Hall, starting at 8:45am until 9am, run by our students. This is a whole school gathering and a lovely way to start the week.

New Students and a Staff member

This term we welcomed nine new mid-year Receptions students into our school. We welcome: William, Lilly, Leonard, Lottie, Charlotte, Sebastian, Olivia, Julian and Lawrence. It has been amazing to see them transitioning so smoothly and it has been lovely to see our students making them feel so special. We also welcome Mary and Lorella in Year 4 and Molly in Year 1. A special welcome to Samantha Smith who has joined the OSHC team. Samantha is our new Assistant OSHC Director and she is working in the school supporting students as an ESO during the day.

Building Works

Our adventure play space is continuing to progress. Today we saw the extra turf being laid, leading up to the fort. You can start to see the main structure taking shape and we hope to be using it very soon. The Multi-sports space is also moving along with the near completion of the retaining wall and very soon, we hope to have access to the new mega sand pit, which is exciting.

Over the last few weeks, we have been working closely with our architects, GGA, on Stage 2 of the Master Plan to develop our concept plans for the Learning Street Project. This is an exciting project as we look to building three new classrooms and refurbishing two current classrooms. The complex will be connected by a learning street space that will provide our students with more contemporary and flexible learning spaces. I hope to share the new designs with the school community in the next few weeks. We plan to have the project starting by the end of the year.

Family Playgroup

Our new playgroup is again operating on Tuesday mornings in its new home, the top meeting space in the Parish Hall. It has easy access through the front door and parking is available in the street. With the new improved facilities, this makes for a very enjoyable and fun experience. If you interested in attending the service please contact the front office and Jacqui, our Playgroup coordinator, will be more than happy to book you in or you can just turn up on the day.

We also welcome back 'Little Voices" with Jane on Thursday mornings in the Parish Hall. Little Voices Music offers small group classes for children aged 3 months to 3 years, based on the Kodaly approach to Early Childhood Music Education.

Classes are welcoming, engaging, interactive and fun for children and adults alike. Musical concepts are taught through songs and rhymes, both traditional and new, with the use of puppets, props, stories and percussion instruments for added enjoyment. If this information is not included, it is difficult to identify that your payment is for OSHC fees and there is then the possibility that it is not receipted against your OSHC account.

Registering your Child for OSHC

If you wish your child/children to attend Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) for either Before or After School Care, we require registration with 'Fully Booked' prior to session attendance. This system is both user friendly and streamlined to ensure that registration is a simple process and that families are able to manage their own bookings/cancellations as needed.

Initial setup will require you to register an account and complete all necessary information required using the following link: http://stjotran.fullybookedccms.com.au/family/

It is important to note that when you create your bookings through Fully Booked, the session type will automatically default to the Full Casual rate. If this is not what is required, you will need to deselect the ticked box in the top left hand corner of the booking screen and select available options from the drop down menu. Unfortunately we are unable to change past bookings, so please make sure you go through this process to ensure the correct rate is charged.

How to Volunteer in our School

Information for Volunteering - Due to changes in the Child Protection Act

At St Joseph's School Tranmere, we are always grateful for the support given by our volunteers. Volunteering applies to a wide range of activities in the school including attending excursions, coaching sports teams, reading in the classroom, helping in the many committees and many other school-related activities.

If you would like to act as a volunteer in the school, you are required to have a 6-point check. Please provide the school with copies of the following:

- . Completed CESA Volunteer Registration pack available from the school office
- A Catholic Police Check Clearance or Working With Children Check (WWCC from the Department of Human Services (if
 you need to obtain this clearance please come to the school office)
- A RRHAN-EC (Responding to Harm, Abuse and Neglect in Education and Care) training Certificate
- Work Health and Safety on-line Induction for Volunteers Certificate
- · Work Health and Safety signed form
- COVID Status Certification

Please note: that all these processes are mandatory and must be completed in order to volunteer/continue to volunteer. This requirement is designed to ensure our children are protected and safe at school.
